

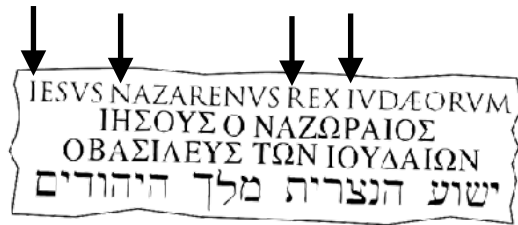


Did'ja Know?!

Color the cross below, reminding yourself of the sacrifice Jesus made for all people, everywhere.

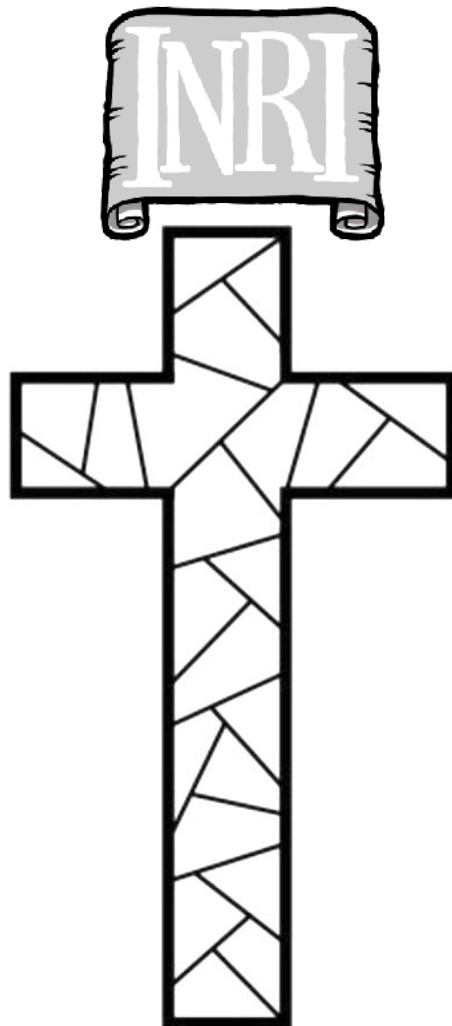
I N R I



Some think this is what the sign actually may have looked like. There are three languages on the sign. From the top down:

- Latin
- Greek
- Aramaic (which was the language Jesus probably spoke)

Translated, it means:
"Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews."

The Romans forced Jesus to carry a big, wooden cross out to a place called The Place of the Skull - in Hebrew it's called "Golgotha." There, they nailed Jesus to the cross and stood the cross up between two other criminals on their own crosses.

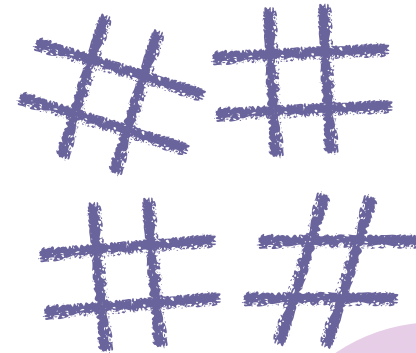
